COUNSELING SOUND-BYTE: Each month, we focus on themes regarding student Character & Leadership. Holmes and Peet have both collectively committed to going through lessons in each 4th hour classroom every Monday. These 10 minute lessons provide food-for-thought and help students self-reflect about themselves and their actions. Lessons include media content as well as discussion questions led by teachers. For October, we will be focusing on Preparation and Attendance. These are conversations that we would love for you to continue at home with your student(s). What does preparation mean? How do individual students prepare for different aspects of their life whether academics, athletics, music, etc.? What does it mean to prepare yourself to come to school? What is the difference between being sick versus not feeling well? When should you stay home?

We want students and parents to have the facts:

Did you know?

- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Missing 10 percent of the school year, or about 18 days, negatively affects a student's
 academic performance. That's just two days a month and that's known as chronic
 attendance.
- A high school graduate earns, on average, \$1 million more than a dropout over a lifetime.
- A student who misses 10 day or more during the school year is 20% less likely to graduate from high school and 25% less likely to ever enroll in college.
- Chronic attendance can affect your ability to earn a living. Dropouts are less likely to succeed in a career. And even those who do graduate won't do well at work without good attendance habits.

We challenge all students and parent/guardians to do their own attendance check! Look at your student(s) total absences on PowerSchool. Is there room for improvement? How could your student(s) commit to to ensure they miss no more than ____ days for the rest of the school year? (9 or fewer absences = satisfactory attendance) If you need ideas on how to improve your child's attendance or preparation in school, please contact your school counselor!

END OF QUARTER 1: The End of Quarter 1 will be on Friday, October 26th. Up-to-date grades will be viewable on Monday, October 29th. Grades will be handed out at Conferences on Monday, October 29 and Thursday, November 1.

October 1st is set as Stomp out Bullying Day. Students wear blue on Monday, October 1st to recognize that we all must work together to stop Bullying and increase awareness of the impact that bullying has on all students. Please mark your calendars for October 1st and wear blue in support of this initiative!

<u>HOMEWORK COMPLETION:</u> Please make sure your student(s) are completing their homework. We ask our teachers to only assign homework if it is meaningful and necessary to help students learn what is needed for their course. Because of that, we expect all students to complete their assigned homework on time. Students that need extra time are provided that time when they are genuinely trying.

Students that choose to not do their work are assigned to one hour of detention after school. We do this for a number of reasons:

- Students need to have a full understanding of the material.
- Students need to be prepared for classroom activities.
- The consequence for not doing the work is doing the work.

At Peet Jr. High, academics is the priority. If students have an activity after school, that is not a reason to miss detention. Getting the work done is the priority. Students out for athletics have to serve the hour and then go to practice or game.
