### Item No. 7 - Approval of 2016-2017 School Year Calendar Adjustment

Dr. Pattee reviewed the request to adjust the current 2016/17 school year calendar and stated this would be a non- precedent adjustment. The District determines the calendar based on the number of hours of curriculum time. The District has a very unique situation. The school year began with flooding in September 2016. # Item No. 8 - Approval of Plans & Specifications and Set Public Hearing for 2017 Orchard Hill Playground Equipment

Mr. Nefzger reviewed the plans, specifications for the installation of playground equipment at Orchard Hill Elementary. The District is replacing the playground equipment due to a portion the current playground equipment not meet the new safety standards and the upcoming construction project will require the District to relocate existing playground equipment. The recommendation for the type of playground equipment was made by Orchard Hill staff and Orchard Hill POWWER (parent group). The base bid is for new playground equipment with an estimated capacity of 76-80 students. As an alternate, the District is going to bid two additional pieces of playground equipment. The District will also be relocating the current equipment that still meets safety standards and all equipment will be combined into one location. Mr. Nefzger reported the Orchard Hill POWWER group graciously agreed to donate up to \$30,000 for the replacement and installation of new playground equipment. The project will be funded through the 2017-2018 school year physical plant and equipment levy. After discussion Director Leeper moved and Director Hines seconded the motion to approve the plans, specifications and form of contract and set April 10, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. as the date and time to hold a public hearing for the 2017 Orchard Hill Elementary playground project. # Item No. 10- Approval of 28 E Agreement with UNI and City of Cedar Falls - Tennis Court Project

Mr. Nefzger reviewed the 28E agreement for the joint operation of the new tennis court complex that will be built on the University of Northern Iowa campus. The 28E agreement outlines a description of the shared facilities, governance, financing, construction, scheduling tennis complex time usage, and management of the facilities. The 28E agreement is a culmination of the original memorandum of understanding that was signed between UNI, City of Cedar Falls and the District to develop and operate as a joint tennis complex. The budget for Phase I of the construction is \$1.5 million. The project has received a \$500,000 grant from Black Hawk County Gaming Commission towards the construction of the project. After discussion, Director Lantz moved and Director Hassman seconded the motion the Cedar Falls Community School District Board of Education approve the 28E agreement for joint use between the University of Northern Iowa, City of Cedar Falls, and the Cedar Falls Community School District as presented.

# Item No. 11- Approval of the 2017-2018 Proposed Budget for Publication and Set Public Hearing Date

Mr. Nefzger presented the 2017-2018 proposed budget to the Board of Education including information on operating fund revenues from local, state, federal sources and required expenditures for these funds. The proposed tax rate for the 2017-2018 school year would be \$14.27271 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, up from \$12.76973 for the current 2016-2017 school year. Primary reason for the change is the implementation of the debt service levy for the \$32 million General Obligation bonds the community approved in April 2016. This amounts to \$1.18791 of the total. The remaining increase is primarily due to a request for additional dollars for the management levy, as well as the District's cash reserve levy. After discussion, Director Shaw moved and Director Lantz seconded the motion that the Cedar Falls Board of Education direct the secretary to publish the budget estimate and notice of public hearing, as required by law, in the Waterloo/Cedar Falls Courier, and that the public hearing for the 2017-2018 proposed budget be held at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 10, 2017 at the City of Cedar Falls City Hall, 220 Clay Street, Cedar Falls Iowa 50613. #### Item No. 12- Approval of the 2016-2017 School Year Budget Amendment and Set Public Hearing

Mr. Nefzger reviewed the proposed expenditure amendment to the 2016-2017 school year for instructional programs from \$40,700,355 to \$41,444,549. This increase is for expenditures from the new Teacher Learning Community (TLC) grant, additional technology equipment, additional staff and equipment due to increasing student enrollment. An increase in support services from \$16,392,197 to \$17,005,312 for technology equipment from increasing student enrollment. An increase in other expenditures from \$12,361,198 to \$34,912,469 for refinancing of the Series 2011 revenue bonds and implementation of elementary construction projects. The amendment to the 2016-2017 school year budget will not raise property taxes, but will give the District the legal authority to spend the additional dollars necessary for the additional expenses. After discussion, Director Hassman moved and Director Hines seconded the motion that the Cedar Falls Board of Education set 7:00 p.m. Monday, April 10, 2017 at the City of Cedar Falls City Hall, 220 Clay Street, Cedar Falls Iowa 50613 as the time, date, and place to hold a public hearing to amend the current 2016-2017 school year estimated budget expenditures. Directors voting in favor of the motion Coil, Hassman, Hines, Kenyon, Lantz, Leeper, and Shaw. Those voting "no" none. Motion carried.
