POWWER funded the Teacher Request for IXL from 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grades at a cost of \$4,306.25

IXL is used as a force multiplier for teachers in these grades to encourage kids to focus on their Math Skills.

Last year, IXL was used by students at Orchard Hill Elementary a total of 2,415 hours. 2024-2025.

8,992 skills mastered using IXL,10,041 skills that were rated proficient,17,763 skills practiced.

Students in Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th grades can use IXL at home. There is a computer based, I-Phone, and Android application. 2024-2025.

Kindergarten has asked for a subscription to ToDoMath \$1,349.97

The subscription would be solely for kindergarten there is a computer based, I-Phone, and Android application for home use.






If you have concerns step one is to reach out to the school staff, teacher/principal/ administrative staff. We're here to help you in any way we can to address attendance issues.

Please be kind with the administrative staff, while we all adjust to this. We're just complying with SF2435 and we're here to support you.

Attendance Policy changes due to SF2435 (reduced to policy relevant to OH Elementary School (2)

- When your child is absent call/email the school. The absence will be recorded as excused or unexcused absence.
 - I. Present Student is at school or participating in a school activity.
 - Participation in school activities (fine arts, athletics, robotics, class trip, ect)
 - In-school suspension, detention/ect
 - 2.Absent Exempt (Excused)
 - Medical Excusal (doctor note, school nurse, health pan, planned medical treatments)
 - Court Excusal
 - Attending religious services or receiving religious instruction
 - IEP or 504 plan affects attendance.

Attendance Policy changes due to SF2435 (reduced to policy relevant to OH Elementary School (3)

3. Absent - Non-Exempt (unexcused)

- Any reason not previously listed
- Sick, parent confirmed
- Watching athletics, show choir, or other school activities (not participating)
- Absent (parent excused no reason given)
- Family Vacation "Out of Town"
- Car Trouble
- Arrived to school and classes were "skipped"
- Out-of-school suspension
- Non-school related activities (gymnastics, hockey, community theater, ect)

Definition Changes due to SF 2435

- "<u>Chronic Absenteeism</u>" is missing more than 10% of scheduled school days or instructional hours, regardless of the reason for the absence (please note the exemptions listed in #2 above). In Cedar Falls, this would be defined as missing the equivalent of 18 days of school.
- "<u>Truancy</u>" is missing more than 20% of scheduled school days or instructional hours. In Cedar Falls, this is the equivalent of 36 days of school.

- If your leader has 12 non-exempt absences, there will be an engagement meeting to identify any potential supports to parents to prevent further action. At 24 non-exempt absences there will be a second engagement meeting.
- If your child does become truant by missing 36 days of school the school notifies the county attorney for the county attorney to enforce compulsory attendance laws.

What is a WIG? What is THIS year's WIG

- A Wildly Important Goal (WIG) is a goal that is so important that if it's not achieved, other accomplishments are not as significant. WIGs are different from other goals in a few ways:
- Measurable: WIGs must be clear, specific, and measurable.
- Prioritization: WIGs help teams prioritize and focus on the most important goals.
- Focus: WIGs help teams focus on the bigger picture instead of getting distracted by daily tasks.

- This year's WIG is: We will increase student proficiency from 71% to 76% my Jan 23, 2024 in reading.
- It will be measured by: Winter FAST CMBR and early reading scores.
- It will be prioritized by: Each student will have two lead measures in their leader notebook to track 1-engagement 2- a reading strategy
- It will be focused on by: Students and teachers tracked at student, class, grade, and building

Ms. Chris's Goals for School Year 2024-2025



1. Increase student achievement in reading and math- all students meeting typical or aggressive growth on FAST assessments



2. Raise overall daily attendance



3. Recertify as a Lighthouse School in November



4. Be systematic with data to inform our instructional decisions.
