

How long is the training and how is it implemented?

- 3 hours
 - o Can be divided up into two 1.5 hour sessions or three 1 hour sessions
- Offered virtually and in person
 - o 8 participants minimum required for in person
 - At a location of the group's choice
 - Location must have access to Wi-Fi, a presentation screen with sound, and an HDMI cord to plug in a laptop to play videos
 - o 6 participants minimum required for virtual
- Participants watch videos with expert advice and survivor stories followed by facilitated discussions and practical scenarios to put learning into practice

What is the cost of the training?

- It is free thanks to grants and funding!

What information is provided during the training?

- Participants learn to prevent, recognize, and respond to child sexual abuse utilizing The Five Steps to protecting children, which includes: knowing the statistics, minimizing the opportunity, talking about it with children & adults, recognizing the signs, and learning how to respond to & report suspicion, discovery, or disclosure of child sexual abuse.

What do participants gain from this training?

- Become empowered to keep children safe, a personal workbook to keep, earn an individual certificate, acquire a "Stewards of Children Champions" certificate for a group/organization with 100% attendance.
- 3 CEU's when applicable
