Iowa Seal of Biliteracy Cedar Falls Schools

The lowa Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by the District to recognize students who have attained proficiency in two or more languages, one of which is English, by high school graduation. Being able to know and use more than one language is a critical skill for the 21st century. The seal of biliteracy:

- Values language as an asset
- Recognizes the value of language diversity & cultural identity
- Prepares students with 21st century skills that will benefit them in the labor market and the global society
- Provides employers, universities, and grant/scholarship providers with a method to recognize applicants for their dedication to attainment of biliteracy.

Several options are available to show proficiency in English and a second world language. The District receives scores on the following assessments; however, additional exams and assessments can be used to show proficiency as outlined in the Iowa Seal of Biliteracy Guidance.

Students must demonstrate proficiency in English. Cedar Falls current assessment options include:

To be eligible to be awarded the Iowa Seal of Biliteracy, students shall demonstrate proficiency in a world language. The current Cedar Falls assessment options include:

**The District will award the seal after graduation, since the AP test results will not be received until after that date. The student's transcript will reflect the seal once the requirements are met.
