The original budget estimate for the project was \$233,490. This budget amount included original contract, contingency, design and moving of the portable classroom. The final cost was \$207,141. Director Hassman moved and Director Shaw seconded the motion that the Cedar Falls Board of Education accept as complete the 2015 North Cedar classroom remodeling Phase II project. All claims for materials furnished, labor performed and service on this contract must be filed within the next 30 days.
